### About the Proposed Chinook Salmon Fishing Restrictions:

On April 11th the Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC) recommended that commercial and recreational ocean fishing for Chinook salmon three miles off the Oregon coast from Cape Falcon to the Oregon/California border, be closed to protect wild Chinook salmon returning to the Sacramento River in California. The PFMC expects their recommendation to be adopted on or before May 1<sup>st</sup>. The Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission will determine the fishing regulations from the shore to three miles offshore on April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2008. ### How Will The Restriction Affect Sport Fishing in Oregon?

The proposed regulations will limit ocean fishing for Chinook and Coho salmon. Anglers may still fish for salmon in Oregon's bays and rivers, *including spring Chinook, and summer and winter steelhead*. At the same time, other ocean fishing opportunities abound. The Oregon Coast offers excellent fishing for Coho salmon, halibut, rockfish and tuna, while inland rivers and lakes offer anglers opportunities for trout and warm water species such as bass, crappie and bluegill.
